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SCHOOL HISTORY & COMMUNITY

The Academy of the Holy Angels is an independent college preparatory school for young women. Established by the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1879, Holy Angels is the oldest private school in Bergen County. The Academy is located on a 24-acre campus in Demarest, NJ. Known originally as Holy Angels Collegiate Institute, the Academy attracted students from all over the world. Demarest is an upper middle class community of about 5,000 people located just ten miles from New York City. The present student body comes from 96 cities and towns in NJ and NY. Holy Angels accepts students from many different communities, ethnic backgrounds and religious affiliations.

ADMISSIONS

The Academy is recognized for its outstanding academics as a highly competitive, college preparatory, four-year high school for young women. Students are accepted on the basis of the Archdiocesan Cooperative Exam, school records, and teacher recommendations. Out of state and international students may opt to take the SSAT in place of the COOP.

MOST RIGOROUS CURRICULUM

VIRTUAL HIGH SCHOOL

As increasing numbers of our graduates pursue college majors and careers in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art/Design and Mathematics, Holy Angels has formed a partnership with the Virtual High School to bring an engineering course to seniors committed to this field in the first semester of senior year. The program provides an opportunity for qualified students to take courses online that Holy Angels would not typically be able to provide. Students participating in the Virtual High School take their online classes on their own time.

STATEMENT OF CLASS RANK

Due to the selectivity of the admissions process, the challenging nature of the Academy's curriculum, and the high academic caliber of the student body, the cumulative weighted average is regarded as the most significant indicator of student performance. Thus, the Academy does not rank students.

GRADING SYSTEM

Achievement is reported by numerical grades.

All AHA courses are used to calculate cumulative weighted GPAs, except for Phys Ed, Community Service & Summer School.

Cumulative weighted averages are computed six times: at the end of the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th (College Mid-Year), and 8th (Final) semesters using the appropriate multiplier.

COLLEGE COURSES

Fairleigh Dickinson University Middle College Program

College courses are offered to Juniors and Seniors through the Fairleigh Dickinson University 'Middle College Program'. Seven university courses are offered for credit. The courses are: Anatomy & Physiology-H/MCP, International Studies/MCP, Calculus-HH/MCP, Classical Humanities-H/MCP, French IV-H/MCP, Italian IV-H/MCP, and Organic Chemistry-H/MCP.

HUMANITIES STUDY ABROAD

Students travel to the culturally rich heart of Europe to study the architecture, art, music and culture of the 17th and 18th centuries in Austria and Germany. Regular classes are held both in classrooms and in “the classroom without walls” at various sites in our travels, such as churches, museums, palaces and concerts. Excursions to important historical and cultural sites are included, such as visits to Mozart's birth house, Dachau concentration camp, the Eagle's Nest and Heidelberg Castle. While in Munich, students visit the SSND motherhouse, which houses the tomb of Blessed Theresa Gerhardinger. Students earn a semester credit for successful completion of the course and the final grade is included in their high school transcript. The program is offered in alternating years to rising juniors and rising seniors.

ANGELS ADVANTAGE EXTERNSHIP PROGRAM

This program provides students with opportunities to shadow or work alongside professionals in a variety of career settings within the New York Metropolitan Area. These career mentors are drawn from present and past parents, and Academy alumnae.

DISCIPLINE REPORTING

The Academy of the Holy Angels values integrity and honesty. Thus, student disciplinary actions are self-reported. Students, when asked about discipline, are expected to respond in an honest and forthright manner.
